




Global Youth Forum on Climate Change




Analysis of submitted NAPs





- 47% of NAPs refer to women and gender considerations in the context of business development, entrepreneurship, and MSMEs
- 24% mention youth in the context of entrepreneurship and adaptation
- Ongoing mapping of entrepreneurship in NAPs and NAP Readiness Proposals
- Input from countries as case studies to feed into the research
- Analysis of gaps, barriers, constraints, challenges, good practices, experiences etc.
